Permitting Pitfalls




- Incorrect AHJ
 - Bad Building Address
 - Unique Jurisdictional lines I had a project that was on the border of two AHJs, and both required a review





Permitting Pitfalls





- Florida and Virginia require a GC License to pull any permit
- Massachusetts requires the permit applicant to have a Construction
 Supervisor License, which includes taking a test with the Board of
 Regulations and Standards along with continuing education
- Several local AHJs require a business license, usually just paying a fee





Permitting Pitfalls




- Is there more than one department that needs to review and approve?
 - Some Jurisdictions require a separate fire department review and inspection, ask early in the process
 - Indiana requires a separate review by the Department of Homeland Security before you can submit with the local AHJ.
 - Some small municipalities require 3rd party reviews and having a certified 3rd party inspector lined up before submittal





- Is a High Pile Storage Permit required?
 - If so, this can add significant time and cost
 - Often requires a 3rd party review of the fire protection system over the rack
 - Commodities list from end user is usually required as part of the review, and often hard to obtain
 - Will need Fire Protection drawing overlayed with rack for review







Start Early!!

- As soon as you have a building address, google search the location to start the permitting search.
 - i.e. "Racine Building Department", Or "Racine, WI permitting"

Review the Building Dept website

 Sometimes they tell you everything that is required, other times you need to call and ask, or find an email for the plans reviewer.



Keys to Success – Manage Customer Expectations

- Ask what the typical review timeline is so you can communicate expectations to your customer
 - Don't forget to ask how long it takes to review additional submittals based on comments back from the Jurisdiction





Keys to Success – Get It Right The First Time

- Understand all requirements for the permit application, submittal, and inspections
 - Do you have all the information required on the Permit Application?
 - Does the city want wet sealed hard copies of drawings, or are electronic OK?
 - How many sets of Drawings are Required?
 - Is a calculation package required?
 - Is there another department that needs to review?





"Cheat Sheet" Template

- Permit Application requirements for a Free Standing Racking System?
 - Is this the correct permit application?
 - How many sets of stamped drawings are required during permit application submittal?
 - Are hard copies required, or can they be delivered digitally?
 - When is the permit fee required (with application or after review)?
- How long does the permit review process take?
- What are the licensing requirements?
 - State Contractor License?
 - City Business License?
 - GC license?
- Is a Calculation Package required?



"Cheat Sheet" Template (cont.)


- Is a 3rd party Special Inspections required?
- What additional drawings are required along with the rack drawings?
- We are planning on utilizing a subcontractor to install the rack system as we are the rack manufacturer, will that determine who needs to complete and submit the application for the racking permit?
- Do any other parties need to review the application, i.e. Fire Dept or DHS?
- Will a HPS Permit be required?
